THE CALL TO COME AND WORSHIP

The message of God's salvation is like a refiner's finer, cleansing us of our impurities. While the advent of the Messiah is marked with hopeful expectation, preparing for this arrival places demands on our lives. The main character's purpose in our *one story* this morning is to put the people of God back under the law of God - this time, though, to put it fully on their hearts. They had survived without much of a country, holy city, or holy temple. But they could not survive without a conscience. Here, on the final page of Old Testament history, through the work of a cup bearer in an alien court, God is giving the people a heart, a conscience, and a hope. Nehemiah was not a prophet, priest, or king, he was a layman. He offered no savory sacrifice as a priest, did not reign as a king in Jerusalem, thundered no searing proclamation as a prophet, nor wrote and preserved no text as a scribe. He was simply a citizen, a common person whom God could use. He embodied the hope of Israel. "My righteous one shall live by faith." The way was prepared - 400 years later - for the coming of Jesus Christ. Let us prepare the way this morning as we call ourselves to worship.
