Missions

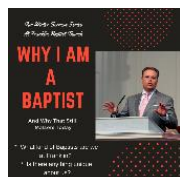

Winter Sermon Series--

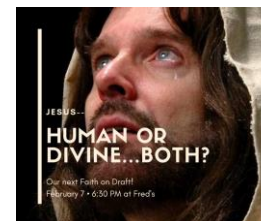
***Why I Am a Baptist* by Dr. Charles Qualls**

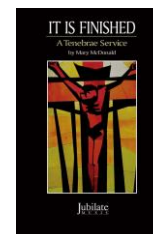
We'll listen to each other and be challenged.
